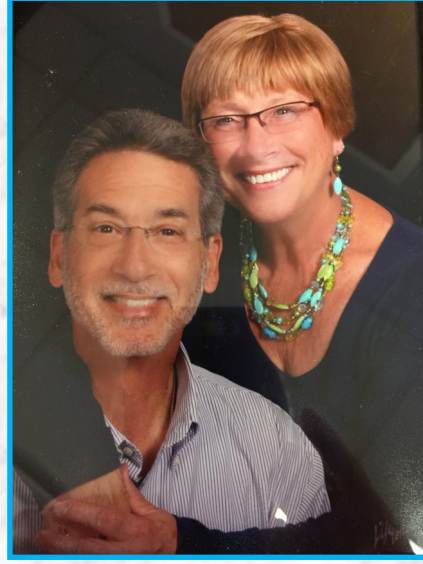

### Valley Elementary

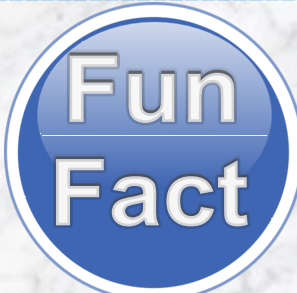
We provide funds for educational materials, a cook to work, and food & snacks for the after-school program.

The Clay IGA has been shut down and the county is working on getting a new grocery chain to reopen in its place.

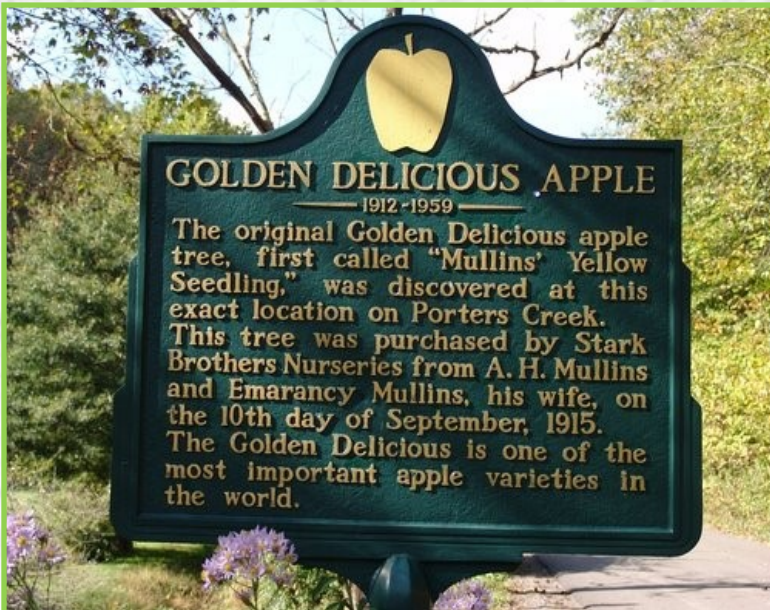
## Partnerships

## What's New?

Our Graduation Mentors worked this summer with students at the Boone Honors Academy, giving students opportunity to make up credits for graduation. They had daily STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) activities and outdoor physical activities (pic below).

The Mentors had 15 students that completed more than 25 credits!

We were granted funding to continue the Graduation Mentoring Program for the '19-'20 school year at Sherman & Scott H.S and Clay Co. H.S. We hope to expand to Van H.S. with continued support from TGKVF.

## Partnerships

### Boone Co. Libraries

We purchased STEM centered activities for 3 local Libraries.

### Racine Volunteer Fire Dept.

We wrote a grant to Boone Co. Community Foundation for \$2,000 and will pledge the remaining funds to purchase 20 new radios. This will help lower a response time in a rural area.

### B.A.R.N. Community Center

We wrote a grant last year to install a community library and computer lab, providing internet and phone services in the Center. Volunteers have been working hard to get it up and operational.

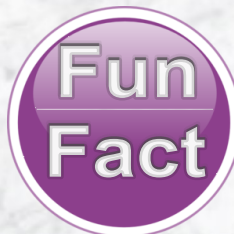
### Agape Cloak

We provide funds for Love Bags given to students in the Sherman district every weekend, which provides easily prepared food items. During Thanksgiving & Christmas, the bags are larger because of the break from school.

### Racine Baptist Food Pantry

## What's New?

After receiving the Buffalo Elementary Gardening Innovative Grant last year, the greenhouse was completed in May. Since then, the students have harvested bundles of cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers, & herbs and have been distributing them to the low income kids. They have expanded, and each class now have their own bed.

Our annual partnership with United Way for the **Christmas Bureau** will start in October. We will be collecting applications which will provide a family Christmas meal and gifts for children under 12 years of age.

We have partnered with **Recovery Point of Charleston** and since April, Julia has been providing the girls with a Zumba class every Thursday.

We have also created an effort called **Sole to Soul** to provide walking shoes for all the girls at Recovery Point. We will be distributing the shoes soon.

We held a food giveaway in May at **Workforce WV**. It was so successful, we created a food pantry for Workforce customers. Many customers are seeking employment and are in need of supportive services.

We provide funds for women in construction to purchase needed work tools.

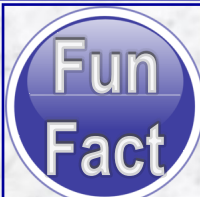
### Pipes & Pipefitters

# ENACT EXCHANGE

## What's New?

We have partnered with KISRA, WIOA, & Bridge Valley CTC and have formed a program called **Trades Education & Development (TED)**. This is a construction pre-apprenticeship program which provides training for low-income residents who are interested in the construction industry to prepare for employment or apprenticeship. There will be two 13-week sessions. The first one started on September 4th and the 2nd session will begin January 6th. This program is now being recognized as an official pre-apprenticeship from the WV Department of Labor!

**Human Resource Development Foundation (HRDF)** has 2 programs that we have partnered with and will be providing funds for. The **Employment for Independent Living**, which is for foster kids transitioning from State custody, rewards the youth that graduate with a high school diploma or a GED with a \$100 stipend. The **Capitol Youthbuild Program** is for youth ages 16-24, who have dropped out of school. They provide hands-on training, & assists with helping find their career path. They receive supportive services and participate in community service projects. They helped with our Workforce food giveaway!

## Partnerships

### Wells Fargo

A financial rep provides one-on-one money management sessions once a month to low income customers.

### Coalfield Development

We will provide funds for tuition to the Coalfields' Workforce Readiness & Professional Success Program (WRAPS) to 10 students.

### Sharon Dawes Elementary

We will contract services to provide physical activities for the students in the after school program.

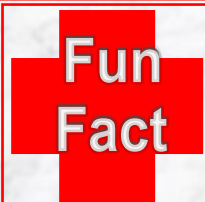
### Mary C. Snow Elementary

**Q: What is your favorite movie?**

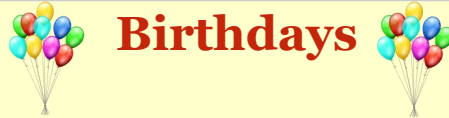

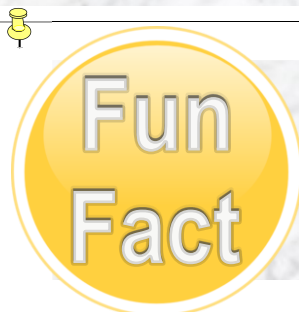
